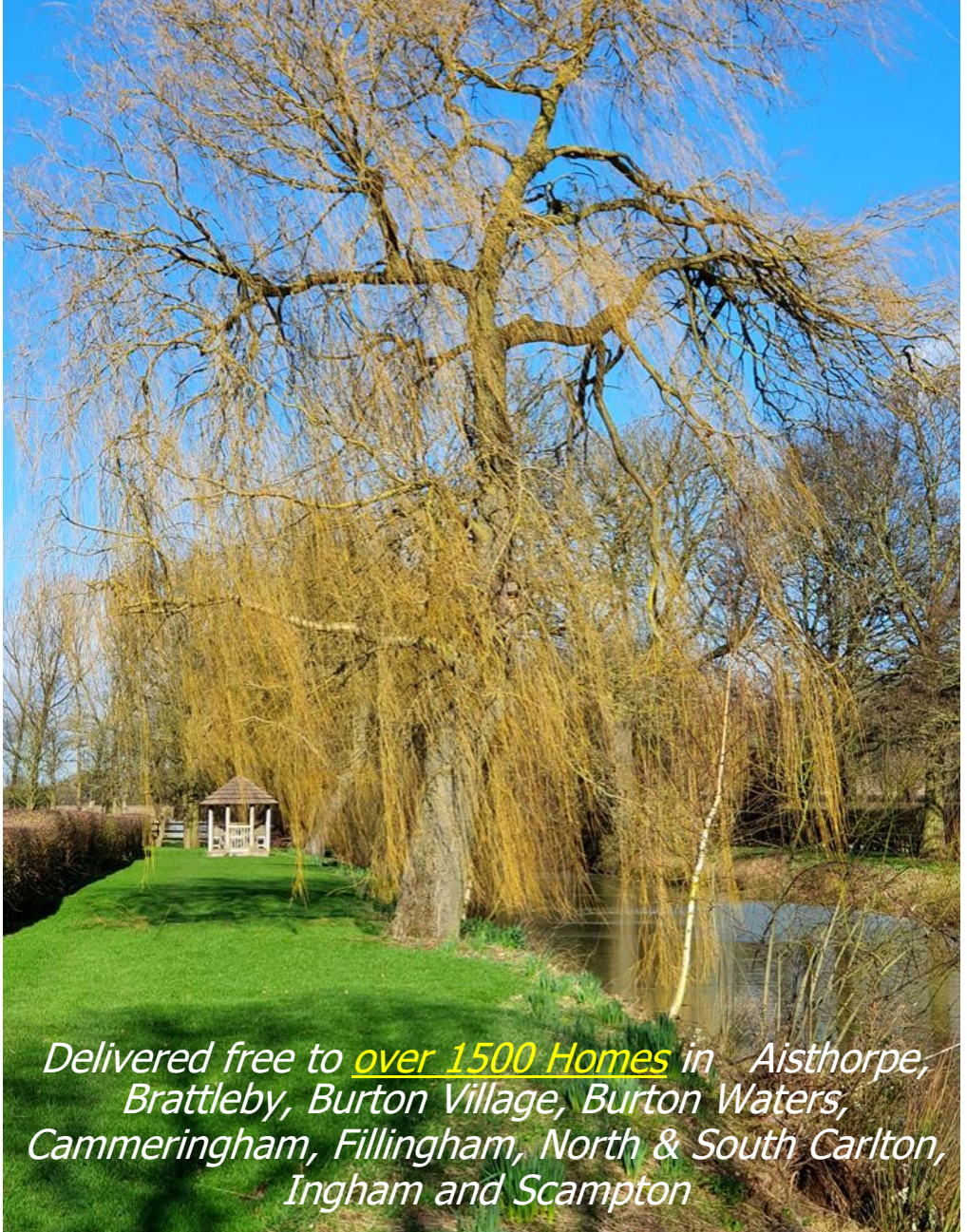

My first 50 albums were all Reggae still love the sound and the beat.

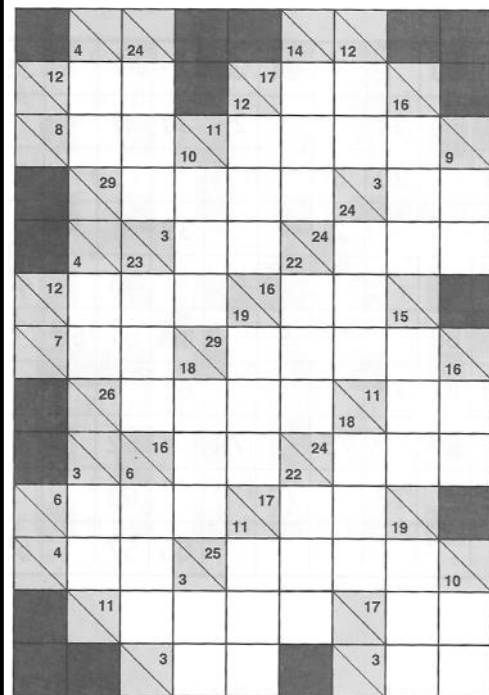

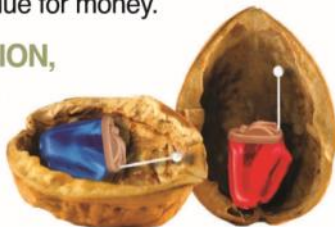

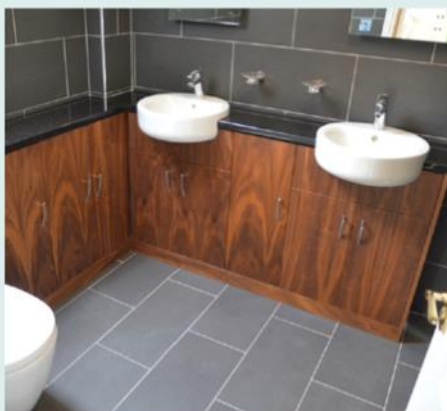

RAF Ingham - Polish Bomber Sqns

RAF Ingham (Cammeringham)

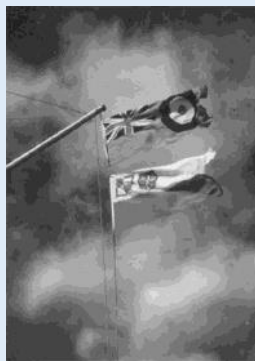


RAF Ingham was only ever a wartime airfield, with construction starting in 1940, and becoming operational in May 1942, with the arrival of 300 (Polish) Sqn. Over the next three years, the airfield was also home to 199 (RAF) and 305 (Polish) Sqns. All three Sqns flew Vickers Wellington medium bombers, Mk III, IV and X. Mar 1944 saw the end of operational flying, with the airfield closing in 1946.



Polish Air Force (PAF) Bomber Sqns

There were four Polish Bomber Sqns in the UK during ww2, (300, 301, 304 and 305 Sqn). Although the PAF



was an

independent Air Force, it came under the operational command of the RAF.

With the absence of any museum in UK, to tell their story, the Polish Air Force Association Charitable Trust, asked us to accept the honour of becoming the Home of Polish Bomber Sqns.

Heritage Group

RAF Ingham Heritage Group was formed in Nov 2010. We

are a Registered Charity, and are run and manned solely by Volunteers.

Our aim is to create a Heritage Centre, to tell the story of the men and women who lived, worked and flew from RAF Ingham, and with the Polish Bomber Squadrons.

Polish Scout Camp - Torksey

We renewed our connection and friendships with Polish Scouting, when we were invited to attend their end of season event at Fenton Polish Scout Camp, Fenton, (just outside Lincoln). Despite the regular showers of rain, the scouts had a great day, and they and their leaders/parents were fascinated to learn about Polish Air Force heritage, and our plans at RAF Ingham.

Visit - Polish Air Force Officer Cadets

During 2019, we were privileged to host a visit by Polish Air Force Officer Cadets, from Deblin Academy. During their visit they received a tour of the Site and were shown a display depicting the history of RAF Ingham and the Polish Bomber Sqns. The visit allowed the Cadets to experience where their fellow countrymen would have lived, worked and flown from, some 75+ years previously. The Cadets were deeply moved by their visit, and fellow cadets hope to return, this year.



Fundraising

The North Wing roof of the Heritage Centre is deteriorating at a rapidly alarming rate, and is of very serious concern to us. Most of the wooden purlins are rotten, and the original 1940s concrete covered mesh roof sheets are disintegrating on a weekly basis. We need to act now, and replace the entire roof before next winter. We need to raise £60,000. It is planned that the new roof will contain integrated photovoltaic cells, allowing us to generate solar power and create a self-sufficient 0% energy footprint, within the Site.

Once the North Wing is water-tight, we can commence its renovation; creating the largest single display area within the planned Heritage Centre. The North Wing consists of 8 bays, and each bay will cost approx. £7,500 to replace. Please support our Community Project
