1. What's New in this Bulletin?

This week various agencies and local authorities have been putting new arrangements in place to support individuals needing assistance whilst self-isolating. New details about how support schemes for businesses and community organisations are also now confirmed and details are available online.

In Lincolnshire there are now clear routes to follow if you are:

- An individual needing help as a result of COVID-19 or self-isolation (Item 4)
- A community organisation/parish council needing support/funding (Item 5)
- A business needing support/funding (Item 6)
- Someone wanting to volunteer to help (Item 7)

This bulletin provides details on all the above under the items listed.

2. Coronavirus Update

- As of Thursday 26th March the total cases in the UK is 11,658, of which 9,782 are in England. There have been 578 deaths in the UK.
 - In Lincolnshire there are 32 confirmed cases
 - In North Lincolnshire there are 6 confirmed cases
 - In North East Lincolnshire there are 5 confirmed cases

Extremely Vulnerable Support

People who have certain medical conditions are extremely vulnerable to coronavirus. The NHS has sent letters to 1.5 million people are who extremely vulnerable.

An extremely vulnerable person or their family/carer can request support online. Support includes getting essential supplies like food. You will be asked for the persons NHS number which can be found on any letter the NHS has sent them.
