1. What's New in this Bulletin?

2. Coronavirus Update

- As of Friday 10th April the total cases in the UK is 70,272 of which 58,817 are in England. There have been 8,958 deaths in the UK.
 - In Lincolnshire there are 392 confirmed cases
 - In North Lincolnshire there are 77 confirmed cases
 - In North East Lincolnshire there are 61 confirmed cases

9. Changes to Parish/Town Council Meetings

The Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government has provided details on two sets of regulations made under the Coronavirus Act 2020.

- The first set of regulations enables all local authority meetings before 7th May 2021 to be held remotely and removes the requirement for the annual meeting this year.
- The second set postpones until 6th May 2021 local by-elections and other polls, either scheduled or which would otherwise arise before that date.
