

# What to do in Summer!

Planning to look after your houseplants when you are away on holiday is not easy. For short absences during the summer, giving plants a thorough watering before going away may be sufficient. Move them to a cooler room away from a bright window will help prevent them drying out.

For longer absences, Use a large container to hold water, and a piece of capillary matting as a wick. Insert one end of the wick into

the reservoir and tuck the other end into the plant pot. This will enable the plant to draw on the water reserves in the reservoir.

2 To make your summer bedding plants last longer, remember to 'deadhead' them. Remove the spent flowers as soon as they look scruffy. In practice, gardeners usually have to



ers usually have to remove them as soon as they can and, thankfully, a few days delay won't make a difference. The simplest method is to just pinch off the faded blooms with finger and thumb. Aim to remove the flower with its stalk to ensure the plant looks tidy.

(3) Marrows are thirsty plants and need regular and generous watering as they grow. When you water, try not to splash the leaves. A useful tip is to sink a 15cm (6in) pot into the ground along-

side your plant. Then water into the pot, so the water goes right down to the roots and doesn't sit around the neck of the plant, which can lead to rotting.



**4** August is usually one of the hottest months of the year - making watering essential. Try to use grey water wherever possible, especially as water butts may be running low if it has been a dry summer.

(5) Harvesting your own seed is fun but takes a little understanding and

planning. plants from which you collect seed must be healthy and vigorous. This will help ensure good quality seedlings and plants. Collect ripe seed on a dry day, as soon as the seedheads (e.g. capsules or pods) ripen. This is often indicated by a colour change from green to brown, black or red, but must be before they open and shed their contents

6 Strawberry plants are cheap and



easy to plant. After the final harvest of the summer, tuck spare runners



(young plants that develop as offshoots from the parent) into the row to fill in gaps or replace old plants. Remove any unwanted runners. Reduce pests and diseases by clearing away the cut foliage and any straw or other debris from around the plants.

Water evaporates during windy or hot

weather, leading to the water level or a pond to drop. The reduced surface area can be dam-

aging for fish as there's less oxygen available, so top up the pond if necessary. Ideally use rainwater from a butt as tap water is rich in nutrients that causes algae to prosper.

8 Green manures are fast-growing plants sown to cover bare soil. Often used in the





vegetable garden, their foliage smothers weeds and their roots prevent soil erosion. When dug into the ground while still green, they return valuable nutrients to the soil and improve soil structure.

Remember :- Gardening is a great way of relieving stress and anxiety too!!!

# **Ingham Parish Council Update**

This update is based following the last meeting of the Parish Council. You can find the most recent agreed minutes on the Parish Council website https://

ingham.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk and the Parish Council noticeboard.

The Parish Council met for their Annual Meeting on 17<sup>th</sup> May at Ingham and Cammeringham Village Hall. This was the first face to face meeting in over a year and will now be the norm for all future formal meetings subject to any changes to COVID guidance. We welcome any member of the public who wishes to join us whether to raise an issue or just listen in.

The Annual Meeting contains many formalities that must be decided upon each year. These included the election of Chairman and Vice Chairman. I am very pleased to say that these remain as Mark Nicholson and Nick Brown respectively. Meeting dates for 20201/22 have been agreed and can be found of the Parish Council website. Policies were also reviewed and adopted and Councillors were appointed to certain roles.

The three year deal on our Zurich insurance policy ended at renewal this year. Following a review of the market, Councillors decided to renew with Aviva for one year.

The Internal Audit report was also reviewed and accepted at this meeting. The auditor reported the following: From the checks that I have performed and from the information that I have seen, I can conclude that the accounts have been maintained to the highest of standards and I thank the Clerk for his careful attention to the accounts and the time he has taken to produce them. I recognise how hard it has been to keep Council business going during the past 12 months and thank you all for accepting new ways of holding meetings and approving payments successfully. I have looked at bank statements and reconciliations, income and expenditure, invoices, payments, chequebooks, fixed asset register, risk assessments, VAT returns, salaries and PAYE returns as well as the minutes of the meetings.

Another formality at this time of year to review and approve the Annual Governance Statement and Accounting Statements that must be sent to our External Auditor, PKF Littlejohn, for review. Members of the public may request to review the financial records of the Parish Council during the Exercise of Public Rights which have been set to run between 14<sup>th</sup> June and 23<sup>rd</sup> July. These statements may be found on the Parish Council website and the Parish Council noticeboard.

Recreation area project: The Chair of the Governors of Ingham Primary School attended the annual meeting of the Parish Council to provide feedback from a survey conducted with students about their preferences or otherwise for equipment at the play park recreation area. This really useful information will be combined with the results of the questionnaires circulated to the community to form an idea for the scope of the project. The Parish Council thank Ingham School for their support.

Neighbourhood Plan: The Parish Council aim to hold public events to receive resident's feedback about the sites' assessments for Ingham as soon as possible once COVID restrictions are fully lifted.

Following receipt of a report on the condition of trees on the Green, Old Pond site and West End the Parish Council have requested and received three quotes for this work. West Lindsey District Council have also approved these works to be undertaken. A decision on who to allocate the work to will be made at the next Parish Council meeting.



We're also looking forward to events we have planned with our good friends at Pollyplatt School – part of the commemorative stained glass window project for Scampton Church and with Ingham School – a residential visit to Castleton. We hope that next year our inter school sports events will again be up and running to further strengthen our bonds.

We're delighted to have the opportunity to contribute to the Village Venture and send our warmest greetings to the local community. At the same time, we would like to thank all those in the community, past and present who have supported our small village church school and made it a special place for many children.

# FRESH from ALISON'S KITCHEN

A fine offering for enjoying in the garden with a beer or glass of red. Serves 3-4

#### Ingredients:

- 200g (7oz) asparagus tips
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 thick rump steak weighing about 500g (1lb 2oz)
- Salt & pepper
- Mixed leaf salad with balsamic dressing

#### For the salsa

- 500g (1lb 2oz) juicy ripe tomatoes, whole
- 2 sweet peppers, halved and deseeded
- 1 large red onion, cut in half
- ½ bulb of garlic, unpeeled
- 2 mild, large red or green chillies

Griddled Steak

with tomato & Pepper salsa

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tbsp fennel seeds

#### Method:

Preheat the oven to 220oC/fan 200oC/gas 7 or light the barbecue. Put the salsa ingredients in a bowl, except the fennel seeds. Season and mix, then spread out onto a roasting pan or skillet. Roast for 25-30 minutes, turning regularly until softened and beginning to blacken or cook on the barbecue. Add the fennel seeds

for the last 5 minutes. Remove the pan and let the vegetables sit for 10 minutes, squeeze the garlic cloves out of the bulbs then briefly pulse with the veg in a food processor. Meanwhile, blanch the asparagus in a pan of boiling water for 3-4 minutes.

Lightly oil the steak and season with pepper. Grill or barbecue for 5-6 minutes each side, or until cooked to your liking. Allow to rest for 5 minutes then thickly slice. Serve with a spoonful of the salsa, asparagus tips and dressed salad.

That's it, all done. When it's ready please give us a ring and we'll be round to sample your efforts.



Scandinavia is renowned for its wonderful crime dramas in the chilling *Scandinoir*genre, and French or Dutch television will always offer something rather more *risqué* than BBC. It only takes a bit of

online research to reveal many entertaining treasures and nothing beats a good summer for breaking with the nightly cold-weather routine of "what's -on-telly-tonight?"

The radio is more challenging, because it's more difficult to channel-hop. The best way to eliminate any tedious reminders of the current state of affairs is to discover *BBC Sounds* on your computer or tablet. There are thousands of hours of quality programmes on BBC Sounds and if you invest in an inexpensive Bluetooth speaker you're not tangled up with wires. My set-up enables me to tune into



something worth listening to, and then carry my pocket-size speaker into



the kitchen while I indulge myself in my favourite hobby of cookery. If I log into a radio drama or a podcast series, the episodes flow on seamlessly, without any interference on my part.

This takes me from lock-down entertainment to lock-down activity. In my case, this is centred on cookery, so I had better stop writing, and rescue my latest creation from the oven.

# An afternoon well spent

Being a dog lover and owner for most of my life I was really pleased when the opportunity arose to attend a First Aid Course for Dogs. The course was delivered by Mandy from 'In the Dog House ', the qualification lasts for 3 years and you get a certificate after completion and passing a final test.



The course was extremely informative and essential learning for any dog owners, we learned not just from the trainer Mandy but also from each other. Candidates were dog owners, groomers, walkers, one owner did dog agility and shared many useful tips throughout the afternoon.



We covered many topics , had discussions on safety and security for our pets . For example were you aware that Rule 57 of the Highway Code states that drivers are responsible for making sure dogs are suitably restrained in a vehicle so they cannot distract you while driving? Dog seat belts or harness are available or perhaps a crate, but this needs to be plastic or fibre glass so it will disintegrate on collision ( not metal) Fines could be up to £5000 and your insurance invalid if an accident occurs due to a pet in the car.

We all know about dogs and walking in the heat, dogs cannot sweat like humans and some dogs are more prone to heat stroke e.g. obese, flat faced, puppies and large breeds , heat stroke can be fatal in dogs , symptoms are heavy panting , excessive drooling lethargy, vomiting , dark gums. Call a vet Immediately if you suspect this is happening. You can attempt to cool your dog down but do not use ice cold water.

So maybe walk your dog in early morning or late evening, or they won't mind if they miss a day because it's so hot and its much safer to stay where it's cool. Perhaps invest in a kiddie paddling pool or a cool mat.

It was interesting to learn how to do CPR on a dog, the hairless resuscitation dog Casper was a very good patient, and we all had the opportunity to practice CPR on him and were given various incidents in which to demonstrate our actions.

Other practice dogs were available so we could learn how to treat them, bandages were attempted, obviously much easier to do on a cuddly stuffed patient than a real live dog who wriggles and wants to get away.



Quick wins from Mandy- invest in a can of spray plaster , very handy if you have 'thin skinned dogs' such as greyhounds or whippets .



in shade do NOT help. Do NOT walk pets in the heat. Paws BURN on hot surfaces. Do NOT leave pets outside in the heat.

Animals don't sweat like humans, so they can't cool down EASILY or FAST. Keep pets safe. Keep them out of the heat! Bee stings- do not squeeze the stinger, use tweezers or a credit card

Feet and Ears smell of popcorn – it may be the sign of a deficiency in their diet.

There was so much to this course, it could easily fill the Village Venture and I would recommend it to anyone who has a dog and wants to know that little bit more and to be able to help them in times of

need. After all, they are part of our families!

Every three months, we listen to your concerns and look at recent crime statistics to shape the things we will concentrate on for the next three months. Our priority(s) for the next quarter is:

- 1. COVID 19 pandemic breaches
- 2. SPEEDING proactive speed checks
- 3. DOGS control and welfare

#### WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING

**DOGS** – we are getting more complaints about dog owners/walkers allowing their dogs to venture into private land & gardens. One our priorities is to conduct patrols to ensure that dogs are kept under control.

We also remind all pet owners to remember that your pets can quickly be overcome by the heat when left in vehicles. Even left for short periods of time can result in your pet becoming very distressed, or even death.

Please also be aware that the hot pavements can burn the pads on your pet's feet; only walk them early in the mornings or evening times as roads and pavements can reach temperatures more than 60 degrees C. Please see <u>www.vets-now.com/</u> for further information.

SPEEDING – we will be conducting speed checks in hot spot areas to reduce the amount of speeding vehicles on our roads.

ASB – since the ease in lockdown rules we have seen an increase in groups of children and young adults congregating at hot spot locations. We have increased patrols in these areas and addressing issues such as alcohol drinking, noise, littering and COVID breaches.
