

The Brattleby Neighbourhood Plan.

During the formation of the Brattleby Neighbourhood Plan - commenced 2015 - a questionnaire was sent to all residents, asking their thoughts and visions as to the future of both the village and its community over the next 20 years. 34.4% of the questionnaires were returned.

The top three top responses were as follows –

1. The protection of trees and hedgerows.
2. The Conservation Area.
3. Open 'green spaces' inside and around the village/separation from other villages by the surrounding countryside, in particular the land registered as an AGLV (Area of Great Landscape Value) **This being, all of the village and lands, east of the B1398.**

Residents were also asked to list their future aspirations for the village (page 29 in your 'Neighbourhood Development Plan' booklet. To date, of the six nominated, all have been achieved - as far as possible - with the exception of residents wishes to, quote, "Seek to expand the Conservation Area, to further protect the built environment."

As this particular aspiration – and possibly the most important one – remains unfulfilled, it is the intention of Brattleby Parish Council to seek permission to expand the Conservation Area to protect the 'Built Environment' and the 'Green Spaces' which surround our quintessentially agricultural village, for current and future residents.
