Glentworth Parish Council round up

The past year has been a challenging and certainly very different one for the Parish Council, but also a period when we have been able to complete some important changes for the village.

First of all, however, we want to pay tribute to our former Chairman, Brian Lee, who sadly passed away earlier in the year. Brian had been on the PC for many years and was one of those people who did so much for his community behind the scenes. We will all miss his experience and wise advice.

Obviously, the dominant theme of 2020 has been the response to the pandemic and, like so many communities, the people in the village rallied; supporting those people who had to self-isolate and it was great to hear the Clap for the NHS every Thursday during the first lockdown. Villages and communities have really come together during this difficult time and it shows the strength of support and well-being that runs through village life.

Glentworth Parish Council has also invested some of the money from the precept on new initiatives through the village. Following a lot of complaints about the problems of speeding along Kexby Road, the PC has bought an electronic speed sign, installed in October. The sign, which can be moved to different locations, will hopefully encourage people to drive through this part of the village more carefully. We are also still trying to get the County Council to repair the road surface, damaged by the lorries travelling from Upton.

As well as the speed sign, the PC has recently arranged for a second defibrillator to be installed, to complement the one at the Village Hall. This second defib is in Hawthorne Close and we are grateful to the support from West Lindsey District Council for enabling us to do this. Of course, we hope that it's never needed but it is reassuring to know that it is there.

Following many complaints about vehicles using the Northlands Road track (in front of Glentworth Hall), a public footpath, the PC has erected new traffic signs and is currently working with the tracks owners to improve the surface to make the track easier to pass. Although on the face of it this is a minor problem, the damage done by the vehicles makes it harder for people on one side of the village to access the centre of Glentworth, so making sure there is a decent and safe to use surface is important.

In response to the ambition in our Neighbourhood Plan, the PC has also been talking to Quantum Fibre, a Lincolnshire-based internet provider that are looking to bring fibre broadband speeds to villages such as ours. Quantum gave a presentation at our September meeting, a video of which can be found on the Glentworth PC website, and it is well worth looking at their website (https://quantumairfibre.com/) to see what they have to offer. If we can generate enough interest, then the possibility of faster internet speeds could become a reality!

Looking ahead to 2021, we all hope that life will start to return to some form of normality, however slowly. For the PC, our priority will be to make some improvements to the play area at Glentworth Village Hall, working alongside the Village Hall Committee to come up with some plans and then find the money.

Throughout the year the Council has continued to meet, since March our meetings have been virtual – just one example of the adjustments we've all had to make to try and get on with life. As ever we are enormously grateful to our local District Councillor, Paul Howitt-Cowen for his continued support for all we do, as well as County Councillor Cleo Pereton-Williams. Residents of Glentworth who would like to know more about the work of the PC or attend a meeting should keep an eye on the notice board where the dates of all meetings are published, as well as the arrangements for logging on to our virtual meetings.

Finally, to all residents have a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, in the hope that 2021 is a little more normal than this past year!





Minutes of the Meeting of Ingham Parish Council (via TEAMS)

Apologies for Absence: Apologies received and accepted from Councillor M.Dickinson and PCSO McFaul, County Councillor Butroid, M. Couzens (Village Caretaker), District Councillor R. Patterson

Village Caretaker's report: The Village Caretaker has been cleaning play equipment, clearing fallen branches and completing safety checks of equipment. The Clerk will ask him to clean the war memorial ahead of Remembrance Day.

Notes of the Meeting of Ingham Parish Council held on the 14th September 2020 to be approved as the Minutes:

Councillors RESOLVED unanimously to approve the Minutes of the meeting on 14th September 2020.

Police Report: There have been 5 incidents reported. On 21/09/2020 a suspicious van was seen on Stow Lane at around 13:40 – unfortunately the wrong registration was given to the police. On 23/09/2020 there was a possible breach of Covid 19 in the village – all was in order upon police arrival. On 24/09/2020 beer cans found behind a property on The Green. On 30/09/2020 Malicious/Nuisance communications was reported. On 02/10/2020 a suspicious van was seen on Lincoln Rd – Police attended and it was a removal van.

Clerk's report on matters outstanding: The Clerk reported that the post box stump on Lincoln Road has not yet been removed. Lincoln Road development—the transfer of open space continues. A tree survey of trees on The Green and pond is currently being completed. Play area lease - Chattertons have drafted the changes. Work to transition to a new Parish Council website has been completed (ingham.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk). The speed and footpath issue on Church Hill around the Church has been reported to LCC. Long Lane classification — Councillor Harris is pursuing this. Faster Broadband — Councillor Harris reported that he had contacted Quantum Fibre who say there needs to be a minimum uptake of 25 households or more to achieve 120mbps speeds connected free of charge but with a £29 per month fee. Parishioners should register their interest on the Quantum Fibre website (https://quantumairfibre.com/broadband-for-homes/). Grange Lane Parking and Planning —Highways are trying to contact the homeowner. Neighbourhood Watch — PCSO McFaul is looking into this. Playing Field/ Bowls Green hedge cut — the Clerk has asked Green Grass Contracting to schedule this. Dead Tree on The Green — WLDC have sanctioned the tree removal. Mr Miller has kindly offered to replace the tree with a Medlar within 5 m of the original site. Remembrance wreaths — these have been requested.



A Short Story


Even coming up to Christmas time, I wasn't expecting a parcel. But there it was, on the doorstep.



Minutes of the last meeting (5th October): The minutes were approved unanimously and signed.

Matters arising from the minutes not covered elsewhere in the meeting:

Village hall windows: Planning consent has been granted for the replacement of the hall windows, kitchen door and window and noticeboard. A quote from Eastfields to replace the kitchen door and window will be requested. This was proposed by Margaret and agreed unanimously. A contract and quality assurance plan for the works are in progress, to be completed this week.

Finance: A Zoom account has now been purchased at a cost of £78.40. Grass cutting invoice pad to the sum of £180 and a new defibrillator pad purchased for £82.80. It was proposed by Glenn and seconded by Ray that the precept for the year 2020/21 will be submitted for £4,783.00 in line with the 3-year plan.

Village Hall: The hall remains closed due to COVID-19 restrictions. New tables and chairs, a fridge and microwave have been donated and thanks were expressed. The security light at the back of the hall is faulty. Margaret will contact an electrician.

Playground: Regular checks are carried out and a small amount of rubbish has been removed.

Update on legal/land registry/charity status: These are ongoing.

Correspondence: Invoices received as covered in the finance report.

Parish/District/county matters: The broken light on the High Street (reference 4152740) has been fixed, however, this has been questioned as the light is only taped up. Highways have attended to look at the footpath on the High Street to B1398 (reference 101000386575) and this remains ongoing. Planning application 141536 High Street has been granted for renovation and extension. The residents responsible for the overgrown hedge have been contacted. The new website is in the process of being built and thanks were expressed to Vicky and Peter as well as the volunteer who is developing the site, for their hard work. There will be meeting of the new trustees on 3rd November for the Parish Trust. There is a very good level of interest for the introduction of fibre broadband to the village and there will be a further meeting on 4th November to discuss further. It was proposed that the village Christmas tree be requested for 5th December but there will be no Christmas tree lighting event. However, it was suggested that the top of the tree be decorated as usual, but the bottom be left for children and any others who would like to make their own decorations and add them to the tree. There was a discussion about ideas for Christmas, including the possibility of villagers being encouraged to decorate windows to create a Christmas-themed walk around the village, and possibly also a competition.

SCAMPTON PARISH COUNCIL

At the meeting of the Parish Council held via Zoom on 05.11.20 the following matters were discussed:

PCSO Julie McFaul reported the following incidents "08/10/20 – RTC on Northumberland Avenue involving 2 vehicles (minor). 29/10/20 –a white Ford Transit van was stolen without the keys from the High Street in Scampton."

<u>Open session</u> Steve Ulyat reported he had resumed the painting of the street lights but the weather was holding him back. All the repairs had been done, so they were safe. The new batteries for the speed sign indicators had been purchased and he would replace the posts on the village sign, in due course.

<u>Christmas lights and village celebration.</u> Due to the current position it wouldn't be possible to hold the Lighting up Ceremony this year. Steve Ulyat said he would go and look at the lights and turn them on at the end of November/start of December. He was thanked for doing this.

<u>Poppy wreath for Remembrance Day</u> Cllr. Patterson would lay the wreath behalf of the residents of Scampton.

<u>Litter bins</u> - the position of the litter bins needed at RAF Scampton had been identified and the Clerk would order them from WLDC.

<u>Speed Awareness</u> Cllr Sneath was progressing this project, which is being carried out in conjunction with Brattleby PC, and hoped that Lincs Road Safety Partnership would soon be able to carry out the training.

<u>Sub Committee on RAF Assets-</u> There was then a lengthy discussion about the RAF Assets and the closure of Scampton. It was felt that little was being achieved by going over the same points at the PC meetings. As a result of this the following points need further discussion and decisions to be made.

There is a Zoom meeting on 17.11.20 at 7.00pm when Openplan would present the recommendations for the closure of RAF Scampton. It is vital that the views of residents are heard before the Parish Council ratifies the proposals and they are sent to WLDC.

WLDC were keen to get information out to the residents and would fund a newsletter. It should contain information from all parties involved. What needs to be decided is who will take responsibility for producing it. WLDC will print it but would need people locally to deliver it.

It was proposed by Cllr. Bulteel that a Sub Committee be set up to look at all the issues surrounding the closure of RAF Scampton and the Assets involved. This was seconded by Cllr Rumble and agreed unanimously.

The name of the Committee would be decided and ClIr Bulteel said he was prepared to chair it, providing he had support from the Parish Council. ClIrs Sneath and Rumble expressed an interest in being part of the committee, as did Tony Somerville and Terry Rumble.

The Committee would report to the Parish Council each month for actions that need to be taken and ratification of decisions etc.

Janet also needed to know if there was any training needed.

The Parish Council was urged to consider whether, in the future we remain one Parish Council or split into two.

<u>Community Awards</u> The name of a nominee had been sent to Neighbour of the Year Award 2020. It would be left until Cllr Patterson was at a meeting before pursuing the matter further.

LALC Training – There was some confusion about the charges and Cllr Sneath would follow up on her initial enquiries.

<u>Parish Council website</u> – There was a question about whether we should pay for someone to populate the new PC website. The Clerk and Cllr. Taylor would work on the project and a final decision would be made at the next meeting.

The Clerk had HMRC had also been paid.

The budget for the coming year was presented and due to the unknown expenses relating to the closure of RAF Scampton it was proposed by Cllr Bulteel, seconded by Cllr Rumble and agreed unanimously that the precept for the year 2021 -2022 be set at £8000.
