

NOTES FROM FILLINGHAM PARISH MEETING**Monday 7th September 2020****Meeting held on-line to comply with Covid-19 restrictions**

In Attendance: Margaret O'Grady (chair), Peter O'Grady (vice-chair), Glenn Cargill (RFO), Vicky Cargill (ARFO), Dawn Greetham (clerk) and five parishioners.

Apologies for Absence: PCSO Julie McFaul, Cllr Roger Pattison.

Notices of Interest: None

Minutes for Approval (meeting 2nd March): The minutes were approved unanimously and signed. Minutes dated 27th August (Zoom) were approved unanimously and signed. Parish meetings were not included in regulations issued and therefore the Parish was unable to meet due to Covid restrictions.

Appointments/review of officers in posts: Appointments for the year 2020/2021. It was agreed unanimously that the present officers will remain in post for the period to the end of the financial year 2020/21. Additionally, Suzanne has stepped down as book-ings clerk and the post will be taken by Sarah Deacon. This was proposed by Sarah Overton and seconded by Peri Hepburn.

Matters arising: Declaration of acceptance of Office are to be signed. The formal documents to be reviewed at the next meeting. There followed a discussion regarding the appointment of an internal auditor. There was an ad hoc meeting on 27th August regarding the Annual Governance and Accountability Return.

Reports:

Police: Two incidents have been reported. 5/8/2020 A male was seen knocking on doors in Chapel Lane selling compost from his vehicle. The previous month there were two separate incidents of a theft of two Ivor trailers and an attempted burglary where offender(s) have damaged a garage door, both incidents occurred on the High Street. Suspicious vehicles/person(s) should always be reported to 101.

Finance: Reports on accounts. The Annual Governance and Accounting Statement has been submitted and the scrutiny period is underway. Advance notice of the budget planning meeting has been given and discussions will take place at the October meeting. British Gas invoice for £115.92 paid for work carried out on the boiler. British Gas boiler cover £29.70 paid. Quote for the broken window at the bus stop to be obtained. The draft precept will be reviewed in November for submission in December. The invoices for gas and electricity to the hall are also due. It was agreed that new utility suppliers will be sought at the end of the present contracts.

Village Hall: A further £10,000 grant has been obtained from West Lindsey District Council, this was agreed to be used towards the replacement of windows in the hall. The contractors are drawing up a final set of plans and renewing the original quote. The new plans will be sent to the council for approval and it is anticipated that the windows will be replaced by Christmas. Due to the Covid restrictions placed on village halls, the hall is not open for bookings at present. The playground and hall have been inspected regularly during the lockdown period. There are no issues with the playground apart from dog fouling on the football pitch and bird droppings on play equipment. An annual inspection is due, Wicksteed are to carry out the inspection. An adult defibrillator pad needs replacing as it is nearing the expiry date and Margaret will purchase a replacement at a cost of £90. Peter is to update the trustees for the land registry and previous trustees have now resigned and new trustees will be appointed.

Correspondence: No correspondence has been received.

Parish/District/county matters: Planning Application reference 141557 has been submitted re. new house on the High Street and application reference 141536 for alterations to existing house. Comments from Parish to be submitted by Monday. Knotweed inspection has been carried out with no further growth found. Building work at the entrance to Rectory Lea has now commenced and it is anticipated that there will be six footings for houses laid and three houses to be completed for immediate sale. A new website promoting the village is to be built. Peter and Vicky have received training. It was agreed that a survey regarding upgrading the existing broadband to include fibre broadband to the village will be circulated with the possibility of inviting comments regarding CCTV to the village.

Any other business: It was agreed that the village hall will seek charitable status which will enable more grants to be available. Glenn and Judith to investigate.

Date of next meeting: 5th October 2020.



Minutes of the Meeting of Ingham Parish Council (via TEAMS)

Date: Monday 14th September 2020

Venue: Microsoft Teams

Attendance: Councillors: M. Nicholson (Chairman), N. Brown (Vice Chairman), R. Graham, B. Buck and G. Stonham. Also attending: G. Monks (Clerk), M. Couzens (Village Caretaker), District Councillor R. Patterson and 1 member of the public.

Apologies for Absence: Councillors M. Dickinson, S. Harris, R. Woods and PCSO McFaul, County Councillor Butroid.

Non-attendance of Councillor: Councillors RESOLVED unanimously to accept the reason for absence of Councillor Dickinson.

Village Caretaker's report: The Village Caretaker reported that he has repaired wooden bins, cleared beer cans from the play area, used pink spray to highlight dog fouling on Saxon Way and completed play area safety checks. The Tennis Court noticeboard will be removed as it is in a poor state of repair.

Notes of the Meeting of Ingham Parish Council held on the 13th July 2020 to be approved as the Minutes: Councillors RESOLVED unanimously to approve the Minutes of the meeting on 13th July 2020.

Police Report: There have been 3 incidents reported. On 20/7/20 there was a burglary on a site on Lincoln Road, 2/8/20 there was an abandoned call to the police, 5/8/20 there was a suspicious vehicle reported on Long Lane.

Speed Indicator Device: The Clerk provided an overview of options and the process that would need to be followed. The Clerk will ask LRSP to review locations in the village and ask if there is an option to identify registration plates.

Clerk's report on matters outstanding: The Clerk reported that the post box stump on Lincoln Road has not yet been removed. Lincoln Road development—the transfer of open space continues. A tree survey of trees on The Green and pond site scheduled for September/ October. Play area lease—an update from Chattertons is awaited. Work to transition to a new Parish Council website is near completion (ingham.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk). Councillors agreed that the Clerk should purchase pdf/A software if required. The speed and footpath issue on Church Hill around the Church has been reported to LCC. Long Lane classification—Councillor Harris is pursuing this. Faster Broadband—Councillor Harris is looking at options. Grange Lane Parking and Planning—Planning Enforcement have found no breach of planning. Highways are trying to contact the owner to ask that there is no parking on the verge that has been gravelled. Neighbourhood Watch—the leader of the Ingham NW has resigned with no replacement to date. Village Venture magazine is now able to publish the Minutes again. The Clerk has asked Green Grass Contracting to schedule a hedge cut of the playing field and bowls green hedge.

P3 Liaison Officers report: Councillor Buck said footpaths are all walkable.

Items raised by Councillors for future agenda items: Councillor Graham requested that car parking is an agenda item at the next meeting.

District Council issues: District Councillor Patterson reported that the Leader of WLDC had stepped down and there are an increasing number of planning matters that are proceeding without permission being required.

CPRE Renewal: Councillors RESOLVED unanimously to renew the subscription for 2020/21 at a cost of £36.



SCAMPTON PARISH COUNCIL - Minutes

At the meeting held on Thursday 1st October 2020 the following matters were discussed.

The Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 3rd September 2020 were proposed by Cllr Sneath, with the proviso that an adjustment to the explanation of why the PC could not support the bell appeal should be added. They were seconded by Cllr Patterson and agreed unanimously. They will be signed by the Chairman in due course.

Open session Steve Ulyat thanked the Parish Council for all they were doing in the difficult circumstances. He felt they were coping very well. Steve was thanked for repairing the village sign.

Christmas lights and village celebration. It was believed that the lights were still on the tree and would need to be checked. It was unlikely that we would be able to have a tree lighting ceremony this year but would not make a final decision until next month.

Poppy wreath for Remembrance Day The Clerk had ordered the wreath and at the moment it is not known if it would be possible to have a formal ceremony at the church. It is hoped that the last post will be sounded, via the new bell system, at 11.00am so it would be possible to lay the wreath informally. It was proposed by Cllr Sneath, seconded by Cllr Rumble and agreed unanimously that the usual donation of £50 be made to the Royal British Legion.

Community Awards In the light of the acts of selflessness and kindness that have been carried out during the pandemic, Cllr Patterson would like to see some Community Awards. Janet Clark had sent out details of the Neighbour of the Year Award 2020, which the Clerk would forward to councillors.

Speed Awareness Cllr Sneath was having trouble locating the radar guns but Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership had just started working again and someone would be contacting her with a view to help resource these and other equipment that was needed. The new Chief Constable, who is a leading expert on road deaths, was keen to put in measures to reduce road accidents and deaths.

Closure of RAF Scampton and the District Councillors Report – these will be covered in the Annual Parish Meeting (following next).

Litter bins - There was a bit of confusion about the location of the proposed bins and a question as to whether we could install them in RAF locations. The Clerk would contact Gill Angel with regards to this. It was felt that 5 combined bins would be needed and there would be a few for redistribution. It was not known whether WLDC would relocate bins or whether it was something we would have to do.

Parish Council website – Cllr Taylor and the Clerk had undergone training on the new website as the old one was being turned off at the end of the year as it was not accessible. They would work together to start populating the new site. Documents back to 2018 must be posted.

Sub Committee on RAF Assets Cllr Patterson has several names, which he will forward to Janet Clarke. Any other interested people should contact the Clerk for further information.



FRESH from ALISON'S KITCHEN

This is an easy and delicious homemade recipe. The carnivores of our villages will love this one. Some of us in Alison's kitchen are already drooling at the prospect of getting this onto the plate. Roll on tea time.

Ingredients:

- 1lb ground beef
- 8 ounces ground pork
- ½ cup onion, finely chopped
- ½ cup water
- 2 large potatoes, peeled and cut into quarters
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon allspice
- ¼ teaspoon ground cloves
- ⅛ teaspoon pepper
- 1 double crust pie crust

Best French Meat Pie



Method:

Combine the beef, pork, onion and water in a medium saucepan and mix well. Cook, covered, over a low heat until the ground beef and pork are cooked through, stirring occasionally. Boil the potatoes in water to cover in a small saucepan until tender; drain. Add to the meat mixture.

Add the salt, allspice, cloves and pepper and mix well; remove from heat. Mash the mixture with a potato masher.

Roll the pastry into two 11-inch circles on a lightly floured surface. Fit one pastry into a 9-inch pie plate. Fill with the meat mixture. Cover with the remaining pastry, fluting the edge and cutting several vents. Bake at 220o (200o fan) for 20 minutes or until the crust is golden brown.

We are not entirely sure why this simple meat pie is described as French. Mange-tous Rodney.

Monday, 5th October 2020

Meeting held on-line to comply with Covid-19 restrictions

In Attendance: Peter O'Grady (vice-chair), Glenn Cargill (RFO), Vicky Cargill (ARFO), Dawn Greetham (clerk), Cllr Roger Patterson and five parishioners, including Judith Russel [acting as witness to appointment of trustees]

Apologies for Absence: Margaret O'Grady, Zoe Rampley, Sarah Overton and PCSO Julie McFaul.

Notices of interest: None.

Minutes of last meeting (7th September): The minutes were approved unanimously and signed.

Matters arising from those minutes not covered elsewhere in the meeting:

Village hall windows: The final quotes and drawings have been sent to the council for approval and we are awaiting a reply.

Review of formal documents: Margaret and Dawn have reviewed the formal documents, with no changes required at this time, with the exception of the Financial Regulations. A minor change to the Standing Orders will be proposed at a future meeting. Glenn and Peter have made some minor alterations to the Financial Regulations which include: reflecting how the Parish works, making separate forms for purchases/expenses, electronic banking, petty cash arrangements. Drafts were circulated ahead of the meeting. No concerns were expressed, and these documents were unanimously accepted.

Reports:

Police: PCSO Julie McFaul reported that there were no incidents of public interest during this period.

Finance: Reports on accounts: Glenn reported that the accounts have now been circulated to include Zoe Rampley and Alan Baldwin. It was agreed to hold a separate meeting to explain the accounts for Zoe and Al, as incoming trustees. Invoices were received for grass cutting and annual playground inspection. A discussion followed regarding the budget planning for the precept for the year 2021/22. The utility supplier has been changed to EDF energy on a direct-debit dual fuel tariff and this was unanimously agreed by the Parish.

Yoga in times of uncertainty

A year With our changing lifestyles necessitated by the issues of the last few months, many people have found their usual patterns of exercise, sport and activities have had to change. Yoga is often thought of simply as physical exercise but there is much more that can be gained from it. The essence of yoga is to keep the body, mind and spirit in a healthy, balanced state. With a history going back thousands of years, the benefits of yoga have stood the test of time and is it now practiced by millions of people across the world. This year regular yoga students have found their practice to have been invaluable and many people have discovered the benefits for the first time.



The starting point for most people in yoga is signing up to a Hatha yoga class for the physical benefits. We want to be comfortable in our bodies and move with ease. Yoga postures help us become more flexible by freeing our backs, opening joints and lengthening muscles. We also build stamina and become stronger, flexible and more stable. We improve our circulatory and respiratory systems. Yoga includes simple breathing techniques - of course you can already breath...but practicing yoga brings an understanding of how the breath and the mind are interconnected. Deep breathing gives the body fresh supplies of oxygen and can revitalise us. When we are stressed or anxious we can use our breathing to change how we feel, to help calm, relax and cope better.

Yoga can be a path to being more mindful and self-aware giving us more tools for not only surviving but finding equanimity in challenging times.

There is now lots of medical evidence for the benefits of regular yoga for people with high blood pressure, heart disease, aches and pains – including lower back pain – depression and stress. Yoga is popular with people with arthritis for its gentle way of promoting flexibility and strength



Over the summer, when Covid related restrictions lifted, my local class started to practice yoga outdoors as our regular venue wasn't available. This was safe and fun – we were very lucky with good weather most weeks. Zoom classes have been very helpful but can't replace coming together as a small community group with a teacher giving individual attention. Are your thoughts racing or is your mind quiet; be aware of your body - scan through it; perhaps soften your gaze or close your eyes; feel the breath in your body and the movement of your chest; notice the quality of your breath - is it smooth or jerky, deep or shallow sips; notice the pause after you breath in, just before you breath out; then notice the pause after you breath out just before your next breath in. Take three deep breaths. Check in with how you feel before you go back to your day.

Dear Friends,

November is a month of remembrances. **We 'remember'!** We remember all kinds of things, people, experiences etc. Remembering is so central to our lives. Playground: The annual external inspection of the playground has been carried out and it was recommended that some overhanging branches be cut back. There was one raised regarding the way the swing is secured, however the manufacturer confirms that the swing has been correctly installed.

Update on legal/land registry/charity status: Glenn has expressed the requirement for the Parish to appoint an internal auditor for the accounts. Al volunteered to act as an internal auditor for future audits.

Correspondence: Invoices received have been covered under Finance above.

Parish/District/county matters: Cllr Patterson addressed the meeting and gave an update regarding the functioning of the Council under the present restrictions. RAF Scampton will be decommissioned and there may be a heritage centre on site as well as RAF Ingham. Cllr Patterson visited Fillingham with a senior councillor and updated him on the work of the present Parish meeting. It was agreed that the Parish offer the senior councillor the opportunity to join a future Parish Meeting. The leisure centre at Market Rasen is now open. The broken light on the High Street has been reported to Highways (reference number 4152740). The new website for the Parish is being built. Peter and Vicky have received training and the website should be in operation by Christmas. Broadband update: There will be a zoom meeting on Tuesday, 6th October regarding the possibility of fibre broadband to each property in the village.

Two new Parish Trustees were appointed by resolution of the Parish Meeting, as described in Clause 4.6 of the Trust Deed. Zoe Rampley and Alan Baldwin were appointed, and the two previous trustees have stood down. The Parish Meeting thanks Jacque Weller and James Powell for their support, as outgoing trustees. There will be a separate meeting for the new trustees. This was approved by the meeting and witnessed by two members of the Parish.

Any other business: There is a broken window at the bus stop to be repaired (awaiting quote). The path on the road entering the village (High Street) is broken and muddy (complaint raised). The condition of a hedge was raised as it is overgrown along the side of the High Street, reducing the available space on the footpath (owner to be contacted). There is a possibility that tractors drive onto the path to avoid oncoming cars and it was agreed to ask the local farms to remind their drivers to refrain from driving on the pathway. The possibility of a virtual Christmas Fair was discussed.


It was agreed that new utility suppliers will be sought at the end of the present contracts. The new plans will be sent to the council for approval and it is anticipated that the windows will be replaced by Christmas. Due to the Covid restrictions placed on village halls, the hall is not open for bookings at present. The playground and hall have been inspected regularly during the lockdown period. There are no issues with the playground apart from dog fouling on the football pitch and bird droppings on play equipment. An annual inspection is due, Wicksteed are to carry out the inspection. An adult defibrillator pad needs replacing as it is nearing the expiry date and Margaret will purchase a replacement at a cost of £90. Peter is to update the trustees for the land registry and previous trustees have now resigned and new trustees will be appointed.

Correspondence: No correspondence has been received.

Parish/District/county matters: Planning Application reference 141557 has been submitted re. new house on the High Street and application reference 141536 for alterations to existing house. Comments from Parish to be submitted by Monday. Knotweed inspection has been carried out with no further growth found. Building work at the entrance to Rectory Lea has now commenced and it is anticipated that there will be six footings for houses laid and three houses to be completed for immediate sale. A new website promoting the village is to be built. Peter and Vicky have received training. It was agreed that a survey regarding upgrading the existing broadband to include fibre broadband to the village will be circulated with the possibility of inviting comments regarding CCTV to the village.

Any other business: It was agreed that the village hall will seek charitable status which will enable more grants to be available. Glenn and Judith to investigate.


